Mark brought us up to date on the current procedures used at TIA to assure travelers as well as ground personnel that no one who might do harm, is entering what they call a "sterile" zone.

He brought us tips on how to get through the line faster when you travel. It all centers around how to pack. Things should be orderly and arranged so that items can be identified when scanned. There are also suggestions for coats, jackets, gifts, film, computers, etc. He suggested: When in doubt, leave it at home or carry it on separately.

Another tip was the 3-1-1 method. All bottles should be 3.4 oz. size, or less. Pack the bottles in a 1 quart clear zip-top bag. Limit each passenger to one bag.
